There are special checks and training that they have undertaken to make sure they know how to support you, like your teachers, Scout or Brownie/ Guide leaders.

What we need you to do?

Everyone at the Cathedral will do their best to keep you safe. But if you ever feel unsafe, see or hear something that makes you worried, even if it is happening somewhere else, please tell someone. These worries might also be related to something you have seen on your phone or using the internet.

If you are worried, please speak to your leader or a member of the Cathedral team.

Sometimes this person will have to tell someone else so that they can get the best help or find out more about your worry.

- · To learn things and ask questions
- To have the opportunity to make friends
- To have the chance to say what you think and to be listened to
- To think for yourself and not to be told what you must believe
- To be able to talk to adults especially about things that are worrying you.

Your leaders

Cathedral leaders and helpers want to make sure you are safe. They will do their best to help you belong. They will help you to discover more about our Christian faith, a Christian life, and how we fit into the vibrant city of Bradford.

The adults in the Cathedral must never hurt you in any way.

Your leaders have all been especially chosen to work here at the Cathedral.
