





WHAT IS A CATHEDRAL?


A cathedral is the head church in an area, which is known as a **diocese**. The main purpose of a cathedral is to be a place of Christian worship and often large services and events are held in a cathedral that affect the local Christian community or diocese.

A **bishop**, who is in charge of looking after the diocese, has his seat or "throne" – called **a cathedra** – in the cathedral.



The bells are hung in the Cathedral tower, which is at the back of the Cathedral. Ropes inside the bell tower are attached to each bell so that when each bell is pulled, the bells ring.

The Font
The font is a stone container that holds the water used by the clergy (the priests) to baptise, or christen, someone. A person becomes part of the church when they are baptised, as it shows to others that they want to follow Jesus. This is why the font is usually near the main entrance.


