For health reasons, we do not permit intinction (dipping the bread in the wine), but you are welcome to receive only the bread if you prefer. If you wish to receive communion in your seat, please speak with one of the stewards at the main door before the start of the service.
- Please be aware that today's service is being livestreamed and will be available online for two weeks. If you do not want to appear on the livestream, please speak to one of the stewards who will direct you to a suitable seat.
- Please do not take pictures or videos during the service, and please either switch off your mobile phone or silence the ringer.
- Lavatories, including disabled facilities, are available towards the back of church.
- If you use a hearing aid, please turn it to the T position.
- In the event of an emergency, please remain calm and seated. Stewards will direct you out of the Cathedral.

HOLIDAY OPENING TIMES

The Cathedral will be closed, apart from services, from Sunday 25th December after the 10.30am Eucharist, and will reopen on Tuesday 3rd January at 10am. The Cathedral office will close at 4pm on Friday 23rd December, and re-open at 8am on Tuesday 3rd January.

Online Morning and Evening Prayer will still take place as usual Monday – Saturday during this time.

Our EPIPHANY services take place on Sunday 8th January. Epiphany is the second festival of the Church's season of Christmas. In this festival, Christians celebrate the drawing of the nations to worship the Christ child. You are invited to join us for worship at 8am, 10:30am and 3:30pm.
