The Minor Canon for Worship and Nurture

The Minor Canon for Worship and Nurture will focus on developing our existing worship with a particular focus on the choir and explore how we can continue to enhance worship. This role will assume responsibility for enhancing and broadening our liturgy and enabling our choral music to thrive. They will also lead in ensuring that Bradford Cathedral is a safe place for all to flourish.

Revd Pete Gunstone, Minor Canon Designate

Pete Gunstone has been Interim Precentor of Bradford Cathedral since September 2022, concurrent with remaining as Curate of Fountains Church, Bradford. The son of an Anglo-Catholic priest who was a pioneer of the charismatic renewal movement and a onetime Baptist nurse, Pete's ecclesial history is similarly eclectic: having grown up in St James' & Emmanuel, Didsbury, and went on to spend significant time at Soul Survivor Watford, Leeds Parish Church, the North Leeds Vineyard, Lee Abbey Devon and St Andrew's Church North Oxford. It will thus come as no surprise that Pete has recently relished the variety of being concurrently involved in both the newest and oldest churches in Bradford.

As a musician, his musical history is similarly eclectic. Following musical study in the University of Leeds and the Royal Northern College of Music, Pete spent a number of years as a freelance classical musician before focussing his time on music in Christian worship. Equally at home in contemporary, congregational and choral traditions, he also loves exploring music from the global church. From time to time, Pete has been involved in leading music at a range of national and international gatherings, such as New Wine, Greenbelt, the Keswick Convention, and the Lambeth Conference.

Pete has enjoyed getting to know the Cathedral community over the past eight months and is looking forward to continuing to play a part in its ministry and leadership on a more permanent basis. He is married to Kirsten, a maths teacher and former youth worker, research scientist and boarding school house warden. They enjoy walks with their English Setter, Senka, especially in the mountains of Scotland.

Choral Evensong

Choral Evensong is a sung version of Thomas Cranmer's arrangement of Evening Prayer, as found in his *Book of Common Prayer*. It is a form of corporate prayer in which the choir sing some of the biblical texts that form the service, (interpreted by musical settings selected for the day) and the congregation participate through their devotional engagement with those words.

The Dean leads the Minor Canon-designate to stand before the Bishop

Right Reverend Father in God, I present to you Peter Wilfrid Gunstone to be licensed and installed as a Minor Canon in the Cathedral Church of St Peter, Bradford.

A Minor Canon is a priest who, while not being a member of the College of Canons of the Cathedral, is nonetheless by virtue of his or her office associated with the life and work of the Cathedral. The duties of a Minor Canon include frequent and close liaison with the Chapter and staff of the Cathedral, and an appointment as Minor Canon appropriately recognises and affirms this relationship.

The Bishop replies

I, Nicholas, by Divine Permission, Bishop of Leeds, am pleased to cause this person to be installed as a Minor Canon of this Cathedral Church.

The Reaffirmation of Ordination Vows

The Bishop addresses the Minor Canon-designate

Pete	Pete, before you receive this share in our pastoral charge will you, before God and this congregation, renew your dedication to Christ as a priest of the new covenant? I will
Pete	At your ordination you accepted the responsibility of the priesthood out of love for the Lord Jesus and his church. Are you resolved to unite yourself more closely to him by being diligent in prayer and the study of the Holy Scriptures? Will you continually stir up the gift of God that is within you to make Christ known to all? With the help of God, I will.
Pete	Are you resolved to be a faithful minister of the mysteries of God, to celebrate the Eucharist and other liturgical services with sincere devotion? Will you strive to fashion your own life and that of your household according to the way of Christ? With the help of God, I will.
Pete	Will you promote unity, peace and love among all Christian people, and especially among those whom you serve? Will you do all that is within your power to build up the Church which is the Body of Christ? With the help of God, I will.

The Declaration of Assent and the Oaths

The Preface to the Declaration of Assent

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty Nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons.

In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making Him known to those in your care?

The Declaration of Assent

I, Peter Wilfrid Gunstone, do so affirm and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will use only the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by Canon.

I, Peter Wilfrid Gunstone, do swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty King Charles III, his heirs and successors, according to law. So help me God Holding a bible and facing the Bishop, the Minor Canon-designate then takes

The Oath of Canonical Obedience

I, Peter Wilfrid Gunstone, do swear by Almighty God that I will pay true and canonical obedience to the Lord Bishop of Leeds and his successors, in all things lawful and honest. So help me God.

The Minor Canon-designate, faces the Dean and makes

The Oath of Observance

I, Peter Wilfrid Gunstone, do swear that I will faithfully observe the constitution, statutes, ordinances and laudable customs of the Cathedral Church of St Peter Bradford so far as they concern me by reason of my obtaining a Minor Canonry for Worship and Nurture in the said Cathedral Church. So help me God.

The oaths and declarations are signed.

The Minor Canon-designate returns to face the Bishop, who reads the Licence to him.

The Admission

The Bishop hands the Minor Canon-designate his Licence, saying

I admit you as a Minor Canon of this Cathedral Church.

Be diligent so to take your part with your colleagues of the Chapter and the College of Canons in the ministry of this holy place, that here the word of God may be faithfully preached and the Sacraments administered. In all things uphold the honour and dignity of this Cathedral that she may be a true Mother Church to our Diocese, and a living witness to the Gospel in the world.

Revd Pete kneels, and the Bishop blesses him, saying

The Spirit of truth lead you into all truth, give you grace to confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, and strengthen you to proclaim the word and works of God; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be upon you and remain with you always. **Amen.** Revd Pete is anointed with the Oil of Chrism by the Bishop, who then says

Remember your baptism into new life in Christ; remember your ordination as a deacon in the service of our heavenly Father; remember your ordination as a priest and steward of the mysteries of God. May God, who anointed his Christ with the Holy Spirit, empower you for the blessing of his people. **Amen.**

The Bishop hands the Mandate for the Installation to the Dean, and says

Dean Andy, receive this our Mandate and I accordingly ask you to install Pete as Minor Canon of this Cathedral Church.

The Installation

The Dean prays

Eternal God, the source of all goodness; grant that your servant, now licensed to this Cathedral Church, may so advance in faith, abound in hope, and increase in love as to support the Chapter and College of Canons and further its worship, work, and witness, that, having served you in this place, he may find in you his eternal reward; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

A member of Chapter presents the new Canon with a copy of the Cathedral Constitution and Statutes, and says

> Receive the Constitution and Statutes of this Cathedral Church. As far as you are able, observe them, and may the spirit of wisdom so fill you that you set forth God's glory and the welfare of his Church.

The Dean places the new Canon in his stall, and says

Pete, by virtue of the authority given to me as Dean of this Cathedral Church, I welcome you into the fellowship of this Cathedral Church and do place you in the stall assigned to your office as Minor Canon for Worship and Nurture, admitting you into the real, actual and corporeal possession of your office, with all its rights, privileges, and opportunity for service. The Lord bless you in all your duty and charge, from this time forth for evermore. **Amen.**

Revd Pete stands at the top of the Quire steps and is vested in a Cathedral Cope.
