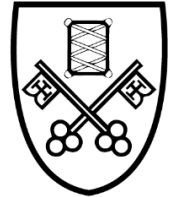

You can also make an offering: via the contactless card reader at the back, online via this QR code that will direct you to <https://bradfordcathedral.org.uk/get-involved/donate/> or by texting SEED followed by the amount you wish to give (max £20) to 70450 (e.g. text “Seed 15” to give £15). NB texts cost gift value, plus one standard message.
- ❖ Communion – please follow the directions of the Stewards when the time comes. If you wish to receive a gluten-free wafer, please indicate this to the Eucharistic Minister. For health reasons, we do not permit intinction (dipping the bread in the wine), but you are welcome to receive only the bread if you prefer. If you wish to receive communion in your seat, please speak with one of the stewards at the main door before the start of the service.
- ❖ Please do not take pictures or videos during the service – this is not permitted for safeguarding reasons. Please either switch off your mobile phone or silence the ringer.
- ❖ Lavatories, including disabled facilities, are available towards the back of church.
- ❖ If you use a hearing aid, please turn it to the T position.
- ❖ In the event of an emergency, please remain calm and seated. Stewards will direct you out of the Cathedral.

INTERIM ORGANIST AND DIRECTOR OF MUSIC. We are delighted to announce that Graham Thorpe has been appointed as Interim Organist and Director of Music. We are recruiting an Interim Sub-Organist and Assistant Director of Music.

DANIEL LAPPIN. Daniel Lappin, our Choir Matron, will be leaving us this summer to pursue wider opportunities as a performing and teaching musician. There will be an opportunity to thank him on Sunday, 9th July during and after the 10.30am Eucharist. If you would like to make a contribution to his leaving gift, please contact a member of the Music Department or the Cathedral Office.

ORGAN WORKS. Peter Wood & Son Organ Builders commence the works this week. The Great and Swell pipework will be removed and transported to their workshop this week for cleaning, and a team will work on site to re-fettle the soundboards and leatherwork, something that has not happened since 1960! The work will also make some tonal adjustments to the organ, making the organ's sound closer to the original 1904 sound. This will have a wonderful effect on the organ's ability to accompany choral and congregational singing. The voicing of the organ - the process by which each pipe's sound is manipulated and regulated - will take place in the week of 18th September. We look forward to hearing the organ again for our Harvest Festival on Sunday, 1st October.

BRADFORD CITY CENTRE WALKING & CYCLING IMPROVEMENTS
