Against the backdrop of the terrible war in Ukraine, the Royal Opera House set up ROH Songs for Ukraine Chorus, bringing together displaced Ukrainians to sing with the Royal Opera Chorus. The first performance at the Royal Opera House in March was a creative exchange, singing Ukrainian liturgical and folk repertoire and opera choruses and received great acclaim, both from the audience and international press. We are now proud to present this Chorus for their first performance outside London in Bradford in preparation for City of Culture. Set in the beautiful surroundings of Bradford Cathedral, ROH Songs for Ukraine Chorus will perform songs from Ukraine's rich Christmas tradition. with some well known and lesser known Carols. We were the first cathedral in England to install solar panels on our roof and we continue to expand and hone our reuse and recycling ethos throughout our community life. We are seen as pioneers in our commitment to the environment by other cathedrals and faith communities.

As part of our renewed vision we have committed, along with the whole Church of England, to be Carbon Net Zero by 2030. At the heart of our own strategy to achieve this ambitious goal we have set sustainable stewardship of the environment as the lens through which we see all our aims

and objectives over the next five years and beyond.

To encourage one another in this we have decided to focus all our Sunday services through September (Creationtide) on the topic of faith and Creation care. Come and join the conversation and maybe join our Eco Group as we grow our work in this area.

At the end of this we will celebrate **Harvest** on **Sunday 1st October** where we will encourage one another to consider giving from our resources to benefit others who are less fortunate. As well as this we will reflect on how this and every act of generosity is a proclamation of trust in God's miraculous provision in the face of seeming scarcity.

Creative Cathedral: Marvellous Morris & Co and their Stunning Stained Glass (Heritage Open Day)

Bradford Cathedral invites you to discover the beautiful early stained glass of Morris & Co., located in four areas, as well as a range of stunning stained glass by other Victorian designers, and a talk from Helen Elletson of the William Morris Society.

2023 marks 160 years since the first stained glass window was installed in Bradford Cathedral, created by Morris & Co.

The famous Victorian artist and designer William Morris founded Morris & Co. and. along with renowned artists such as Dante Gabriel Rossetti, Edward Burne-Jones, Ford Madox Brown, Philip Webb, Albert Moore, and Peter Paul Marshall, created many pieces of stunning stained glass, some of which are on display in Bradford Cathedral, Morris & Co. also produced religious textiles, a beautiful example of which will be on display in the Lady Chapel.

Our stained glass also includes a figure, recently discovered to have been designed by William De Morgan.

The 77th Bradford **Festival of Remembrance**

Join us for the 77th Bradford Festival of Remembrance in the presence of the Lord Mayor and other Civic dignitaries, and supported by the City of Bradford Brass Band and the Bradford Cathedral Choir. The Festival begins with community singing and a short concert, ahead of the Service of Remembrance.





To celebrate this occasion we will be opening our doors to show off our stained glass by Morris & Co. as well as other renowned Victorian designers, with the following attractions:

- Helen Elletson Research Curator at the William Morris Society - will be giving a talk on 'The Art of William Morris and his Work in Bradford Cathedral' at 1pm
- Tours of the Cathedral: a general tour and one focused on the stained glass, both at 12:15pm and repeated at 2:15pm
- Children's activities including design your own stained glass windows and colouring, as well as colouring for adults

In addition, there will be presentations, display boards and videos highlighting closeups of our stained glass windows. There will also be booklets available with more information

Faith and Politics: The Bradford Declaration 90 Years On

saturday 28th October

In November 1933, German pastor, Dietrich Bonhoeffer visited Bradford and made, what would later be known as, the Bradford Declaration. In it he spoke out against the nazification of the Church and, in so doing, publicly opposed the Nazi government, an act that would ultimately lead to his execution in April 1945. 90 years on, Bradford Cathedral is hosting an event exploring the complex relationship between faith, politics and ideology.



This event is part of the Diocese of Leeds welcome of German partners from our link city of Erfurt. The afternoon will begin with a special Choral Evensong where Three Prayers by Dietrich Bonhoeffer will be sung to a setting by Yorkshire composer Philip Moore. After the service there will be lectures by Dr Noel Irwin, Dr Matthias Rein and the Rt Rev. Nick Baines, Bishop of Leeds.

Arts

Journeys of Hope

4th October - 18th November

Bradford is a place of travellers who built a common home together. The stories of crossing into Bradford are stories of departures and of arrivals; some forced others chosen.

For some the life before Bradford is tinged with sadness of pain while others hold onto that previous life with pride and delight. Some have found the life in Bradford challenging and hard while others have thrived and discovered new life. All these stories shape our present and feed our future.

By hearing the stories of first generation arrivals from different parts of the world we hope all Bradfordians will be encouraged to share their own journeys to this place and time.

We are looking to find shared commonality in our different individual stories and identify ourselves in the larger social narratives that have shaped our collective culture.

In partnership with the University we are hosting an exhibition of Ugandan Asian migration stories, alongside stories from the Windrush Community. These two exhibitions will open up dialogue between different journeys of hope from two communities who continue to tell important, positive stories of Bradford's own black history as well as stories of migration to our city of sanctuary.

On Wednesday 4th October there will be a launch event, from 7pm-9pm, with a panel of guests speaking about their own experiences of journeying to Bradford and how they have contributed to our shared history.


