
Creativity Under Pressure January - April 2025



During the UK City of Culture year we will be running three seasons of events, each under a different theme: Creativity Under Pressure (Jan - Apr); Weaving Stories (May -Sep); and Global Connections (Sep - Dec).

Creativity Under Pressure

Arts and culture are at their most powerful and meaningful when they flow from the crucibles of life. At times of upheaval, trauma and change, artists, poets, musicians rise up to express in new creative ways the unchanging, universal truths of humanity. It is under pressure that the arts become their most prophetic pointing us to new possibilities, hidden hope and wells of strength. This season we will be presenting exhibitions, performances and events that inspire us to explore why this is and how we can engage with it.





Join us this season at Bradford Cathedral as we explore art's profound power to reveal resilience and hope.

Highlights include *Beacon of Hope*, an exhibition by Carlton Bolling students sharing perspectives from Bradford's intercultural landscape; *Gideon*, a moving performance on the enduring impact of art amidst oppression; and the start of our *Re:Imagine* series, designed to spark bold ideas, this season on intercultural conversation. Don't miss our WednesdayOne organ recitals either as we hear *Music in Times of War*.

Each event is an invitation to discover how creativity and innovation emerge from times of pressure.
