

Weaving Stories: Visual Artist Job Description

Fee: £7,680 for 30 days work over a 12 month period (£256/day rate)

Location: Bradford Cathedral

Aims

- Creatively connect Bradford's rich heritage with its current community through story and art.
- Produce a heritage artwork that will outlast 2025, speaking to future generations.
- Ensure high-quality engagement with the public and various groups accessing the Cathedral, culminating in the production of the tapestry.

Key Responsibilities

- Create designs for a co-produced tapestry reflecting Bradford's cultural heritage and community stories.
- Oversee embroidery sessions with the Stitchers Group and other volunteer embroiders to deliver the final artwork with designs inspired by collected stories.
- Facilitate public participation in the tapestry project, including inviting individuals to contribute stories and weave parts of the artwork.
- Support experiential events and educational activities linked to the project, in collaboration with the Cathedral's Education and Visitors team.
- Research and integrate oral and written narratives into the visual artwork.
- Work with West Riding Stone Carvers to transfer selected phrases and images onto loom weights.
- Coordinate with the project manager, project panel, and other artists, including a sound artist producing an accompanying piece.
- Ensure all project activities adhere to the Cathedral's safeguarding policies and procedures.
- Maintain a safe and inclusive environment for all participants, especially children and vulnerable adults.

Person Specification

Essential:

• Knowledge of textile processes, specifically weaving and embroidery.

• Experience in meaningful community engagement, particularly with grassroots communities.

• Proven ability to translate narratives into compelling visual designs.

• Strong project management and communication skills.

· Commitment to safeguarding, with a willingness to undertake relevant safeguarding training.

Desirable:

· Professional training to degree level in a related field.

• Familiarity with Bradford's cultural heritage and experience working with its local communities.

• Demonstrable ability to meet deadlines and deliver complex projects on time.

· Research skills to inform creative outputs.
