VISITING CHOIR: HOPE STREET CONSORT Sunday 17th August. The Hope Street Consort is a Liverpool-based vocal ensemble, formed in October 2023, made up of musicians who sing in the choirs of both of the city's cathedrals. Known for their flexibility in repertoire and clean sound, the consort has quickly gained recognition, earning a special commendation for their performance at their first competition, placing second at the Andrew Downes Performance Prize. Having sung at Bradford Cathedral last year, they return on this date to lead the music at the 10:30am Eucharist and 3:30pm Evensong services.
