HER-ITAGE OPEN DAY Saturday 13th September, 12noon-3pm. For this year's annual Heritage Open Day event, we're making it a 'Her'-itage Open Day, with the spotlight on the women designers, often unsung or underexposed, whose beautiful and inspiring work is in Bradford Cathedral. This includes textiles by renowned Victorian/Edwardian embroiderers Louisa Pesel, May Morris and the Leek Embroidery Society, contemporary textiles by Polly Meynell and windows in the Song Room by the 20th century stained glass artist, Moira Forsyth. There will be a fascinating talk about May Morris, by Helen Elletson from the William Morris Society, as well as specialist Her-itage Open Day and general guided tours of the building.
